









Trademarks of Original Delftware

Since 1879, each hand painted article produced by De Koninklijke Porceleyne Fles has been marked according to the following principle:



- A jar
- The initials JT
- The city of Delft

On the left the painter's initials are painted and on the right a year code since 1879. Using the year code list you can find out in which year your Delftware was produced. Over the years, The Porceleyne Fles has carried many trademarks, which changed with every new owner. Here you will find an overview of the trademarks used since 1653:
